Dual Credit Online Course Requirement Checklist

You must be able to complete all portions of the checklist before you are allowed to take a dual credit or online course. The general requirements for all courses are that you cannot have failed or dropped a dual/online course, completed your sophomore or junior year, may not take more than 12 hours per year and no more than 9 per semester, complete all Clarendon College paper work including registering online, and the parent must sign the dual/online agreement with Clarendon High School. (Attach the signed agreement to check list.) Explanations of checklists are attached. Must meet TSI requirements from TAKS, STAAR, PSAT, ACT, or PLAN. (This does not include Accuplacer.)

ELA: Must meet all requirements.

1. Prior high school English class must have been an AP or Pre-AP English course and scored an 85 or above or have an average of 90 or above in a regular English class.
2. High School Teacher Recommendation—This recommendation will take both GPA and work ethic into account...incomplete work will be a hindrance to both high school and college level work. It must be the teacher in the subject area of the course requested.
3. (a) Scored a 2200 on the ELA TAKS with a writing score of 3 or more. or
 (b) received a combined score of 107 on the PSAT with a minimum of 50 on the critical reading test. or

(c) received a composite score of 23 on the PLAN with a 19 or higher in English and math.

Math: Must meet all requirements.

1. Must have a score of 85 in Algebra II for College Algebra and have passed College Algebra with a “B” in order to take College Trig.
2. High School Teacher Recommendation... This recommendation will take both GPA and work ethic into account...incomplete work will be a hindrance to both high school and college level work. It must be the teacher in the subject area of the course requested.
3. (a) Scored Commended Performance on the Math TAKS or
(b) received a combined score of 107 on the PSAT with a minimum of 50 on the math test. or
(c) received a composite score of 23 on the PLAN with a 19 or higher in English and math.

Social Studies: Must meet all requirements

1. Prior high school Social Studies class must have been an AP or Pre-AP course and scored an 85 or above or have an average of 90 or above in a regular Social Studies class.
2. High School Teacher Recommendation—This recommendation will take both GPA and work ethic into account...incomplete work will be a hindrance to both high school and college level work. It must be the teacher in the subject area of the course requested.
3. (a) Scored Commended Performance on Social Studies and meet TSI requirements for ELA TAKS. (See 3 (a) under ELA) or
(b) received a combined score of 107 on the PSAT with a minimum of 50 on the critical reading test. or
(c) received a composite score of 23 on the PLAN with a 19 or higher in English.

Science: Must meet all requirements.

1. Prior high school Science class (Chemistry or Physics) must have been a course with a grade of 85 or above.
 2. High School Teacher Recommendation—This recommendation will take both GPA and work ethic into account...incomplete work will be a hindrance to both high school and college level work. It must be the teacher in the subject area of the course requested.
 3. Scored Commended Performance on TAKS Science and meet TSI requirements for Math TAKS
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
