

Clarendon CISD Grading Policy

Senate Bill 2033 requires a district to adopt a grading policy before each school year effective September 1, 2009.

Grading will require a classroom teacher to assign a grade that reflects the student's relative mastery of an assignment and a minimum of six (6) grades per six weeks must be taken to support the grade average assigned.

A minimum grade (**such as a 50**) for an assignment **cannot** be given and the grade must reflect the student's quality of work.

A class blanket grade cannot be given in any academic class. Blanket grades will be allowed for PE, athletics, music and band.

Local School Board Policy states that a student shall be permitted a reasonable opportunity to redo an assignment or retake a test for which the student received a failing grade.

Clarendon CISD grading guidelines state that a student shall be given sufficient time and opportunity, of which that time and opportunity will be decided at the teacher's discretion, to redo an assignment or retake a test for which the student received a failing grade. The classroom teacher will assign the higher grade of the two grades received on the original or redo assignment and the original or retake test. The highest grade a student can receive on a redo assignment or a retake test is **seventy (70)**.
